ORDINANCE NO. 16-2487 – AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 344 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BERGENFIELD, ENTITLED “SOLID WASTE REFUSE AND GARBAGE DISPOSAL”

was introduced at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bergenfield, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, held on Tuesday, February 2, 2016, and will be further considered for final passage after public hearing at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Council to be held in the Council Chambers of the Borough Hall located at 198 N. Washington Avenue, Bergenfield, New Jersey on Tuesday, February 16, 2016 at 8:00 P.M. prevailing time, or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard.

A clear and concise statement of this ordinance is to amend Item H under Section 344-52 entitled “Receptacles and manner of storage,” to include that refuse containers purchased from the Borough must remain with the property and shall be deemed Borough property, as set forth in the ordinance.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 344 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BERGENFIELD,
ENTITLED "SOLID WASTE REFUSE AND GARBAGE DISPOSAL"**

WHEREAS, Chapter 344 of the Code of the Borough of Bergenfield sets forth all regulations regarding Solid Waste Refuse and Garbage Disposal within the Borough of Bergenfield; and,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bergenfield, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey that those portions of the aforesaid set forth below are hereby amended as follows and that those portions of the Ordinance not set forth below shall remain unchanged.

Section 344-52. Receptacles and manner of storage.

H. Household refuse must be stored in refuse containers no larger than 32 gallons with tight fitting/locking lids between collections, unless otherwise provided by the Borough or purchased from the Borough. Refuse containers purchased from the Borough must remain with the property and shall be deemed Borough property.

Severability All provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If for any reason, any provision of this Ordinance is held to be invalid, the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon final approval and publication, pursuant to law, and upon completion of all outstanding cases.
