

**BOROUGH OF BERGENFIELD
PUBLIC NOTICE**

**ORDINANCE 16-2496 – AMENDING CHAPTER 266 OF THE CODE OF THE
BOROUGH OF BERGENFIELD, ENTITLED “SOLID WASTE”**

was introduced at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bergenfield, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, held on Tuesday, June 21, 2016 and will be further considered for final passage after public hearing at a meeting of the Mayor and Council to be held in the Council Chambers, Bergenfield Municipal Center, 198 North Washington Avenue, Bergenfield, New Jersey on Tuesday, July 5, 2016 at 8:00 P.M. prevailing time, or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard.

A clear and concise statement of this ordinance is to set forth the requirements for the collection of paper, including that all bundles of newspapers and magazines shall be placed curbside on the day designated by the Borough Administrator. In the case of apartment houses, the owner or manager of the multiple-family dwelling unit shall ensure that a special place within the building or enclosed place outside of the building is designated for the storage of magazines and newspapers as set forth in the ordinance.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 266 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BERGENFIELD,
ENTITLED "SOLID WASTE"**

WHEREAS, Chapter 266 of the Code of the Borough of Bergenfield sets forth all regulations regarding Solid Waste within the Borough of Bergenfield; and,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bergenfield, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey that those portions of the aforesaid set forth below are hereby amended as follows and that those portions of the Ordinance not set forth below shall remain unchanged.

Section 266-4. Collection of paper; requirements.

A. Bundles of newspapers and magazines as described in the sections above shall be placed at curbside by the owner, lessee or occupant of a dwelling unit on the day of the week or month designated by the Borough Administrator as pickup day for newspapers and magazines in the particular section of the Borough in which the dwelling unit is located. In the case of apartment houses, the owner or manager of such multiple-family dwelling unit shall ensure that a special place within the building or an enclosed place outside of the building which affords protection from the elements is designated for the storage of magazines and newspapers. Under emergency conditions the time and place for pickup as otherwise prescribed by Sec. 266-3 and 266-4 may be varied by pronouncement from the Borough Administrator of the Borough with notice to the residents given by whatever means are deemed appropriate.

C. Placement of bundles of newspapers or magazines shall not be made at the curb later than 6:00 a.m. on the date of pickup.

Section 266-8. Violations and penalties.

A. Any person violating the provisions of Sec. 266-3 or 266-5 shall be liable to a maximum penalty at the discretion of the Judge of the Municipal Court of \$100.00 for the first offense and up to \$500.00 or 10 days in jail for each and every subsequent offense.

Severability All provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If for any reason, any provision of this Ordinance is held to be invalid, the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon final approval and publication, pursuant to law, and upon completion of all outstanding cases.
