**ORDINANCE 16-2495 - AMENDING CHAPTER 344 OF THE CODE OF THE  
BOROUGH OF BERGENFIELD, ENTITLED "SANITARY CODE"**

was introduced at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bergenfield, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, held on Tuesday, June 21, 2016 and will be further considered for final passage after public hearing at a meeting of the Mayor and Council to be held in the Council Chambers, Bergenfield Municipal Center, 198 North Washington Avenue, Bergenfield, New Jersey on Tuesday, July 5, 2016 at 8:00 P.M. prevailing time, or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard.

A clear and concise statement of this ordinance is to manage the automated garbage collection barrels. The Borough shall provide the residential property owner one 96 gallon barrel or larger for every three bedrooms in the structure, which must be placed along the curb in front of the residence as set forth in the said ordinance.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 344 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BERGENFIELD,  
ENTITLED "SANITARY CODE"**

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 344 of the Code of the Borough of Bergenfield sets forth all regulations regarding Sanitary Code within the Borough of Bergenfield; and,

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bergenfield, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey that those portions of the aforesaid set forth below are hereby amended as follows and that those portions of the Ordinance not set forth below shall remain unchanged.

Section 344-52. Receptacles and manner of storage.

Section 344-56. Administration.

A. The administration and enforcement of this article shall be the responsibility of the Department of Public Works Superintendent or Designee and the Board of Health, the Health Officer and his agents. They may call upon the personnel of the Police Department, Fire Department and the Public Works and Sanitation Departments in carrying out the enforcement of this article.

Section 344-57.

The Borough shall provide the residential property owner one 96 gallon barrel or larger for every three bedrooms in the structure. The number of bedrooms shall be determined by the total bedroom count as shown on the property tax card for that structure.

Section 344-58.

Multifamily residential properties shall receive barrels in the same manner as Section 344-57 above.

Section 344-59.

All barrels must be placed along the curb in front of the residence. Where more than one barrel is provided based on Sections 344-57 or Section 344-58 above, the barrels must be placed with a three (3) foot separation between the barrels and any other obstruction, i.e., utility pole, fire hydrant, etc.

Section 344-60.

In the event a property is entitled to more than one barrel but cannot comply with Section 244-59 above, the property will not be eligible for municipal collection.

Section 344.61.

Any property owner who wishes to purchase an additional barrel may do so by contacting the Superintendent of Department of Public Works. The property owner shall remit payment for the barrel at the Borough cost based upon the most recent purchase order.

Section 344-62.

Any residential property owner at their request will be provided with a smaller barrel from the Borough. Any property owner who obtains a smaller barrel will not give up their right to a larger barrel provided by the Borough. Any property owner who is entitled to more than one barrel but chooses not to take an additional barrel does not give up the right to an additional barrel in the future.

Section 344-63.

Only barrels with the Borough seal shall be picked up by the Department of Public Works.

Severability All provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If for any reason, any provision of this Ordinance is held to be invalid, the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon final approval and publication, pursuant to law, and upon completion of all outstanding cases.
